Club Life

Quad continues to be an environment that fosters social and intellectual growth among members. We seek to offer our members not only a space to eat and relax, but where they can study and work with friends, members and non-members alike. Our range of weekly activities include member's nights, study breaks, and late meal where members can come together and build a sense of community. Our officer corps' web-based feedback forms allow us to hear anonymous concerns, comments, and questions from our members to ensure that we are best satisfying their desires for life, food, and events around the club.

Community Service

Quad's commitment to serving our community remains strong. Our new community service chairs have worked to arrange for Quad to host kids from Community House Big Sibs, to collect supplies for Anchor House, and bring members together to help Challah for Hunger. We are also in the process of planning our annual Quad Auction in which members auction off gifts showcasing their own talents to raise proceeds for organizations and causes close to our hearts. Last year, we were able to donate \$900 raised during the auction to Womanspace. In addition, we continue to participate with other clubs for events intended for all University students, such as Truckfest and Trick-or-Feed.

Outreach

Outside the four corners of Quad, we continue to work to build relationships with our alumni, student groups on campus, and professors. Every month, we host a "Propeller Talk" with the Princeton Area Alumni Association, giving our members a chance to hear groundbreaking research in science and technology while interacting with alumni. Our newly instituted Outreach chair are also continuing efforts of hosting alumni webinars to connect members with alumni in relevant fields. Our connection to campus through our members (who hail from groups including Naacho, SIFP, Acapellago, Lobster Club, the Daily Princetonian, Triple 8, and the Princeton

University Band) is strong. This connection is further fostered through our commitment to welcoming these groups into Quad, both through inviting them to lead workshops for our members and host get togethers in our spaces.

Sustainability

Quad is dedicated to becoming a greener club, and our Sustainability chair is working with a member to begin a backyard composting initiative, and in the meantime we are working on showing members how to separate food and organics from the rest of their waste. Additionally we are creating a Sustainability Committee within our officer corps to find more ways to make our daily operations more sustainable.

Education

We aim to provide a rich academic atmosphere for our members to learn from and grow with one another. Our libraries and other spaces around the club are consistently filled with our members working together. We've continued to improve our study spaces to increase their capacity with the addition of bigger, more work-conducive tables and more chairs. We initiated a club-wide spreadsheet through which members can see who is in their class to facilitate the creation of study groups and note sharing, and continued the tradition of providing a designated quiet work space for seniors to work on their thesis. Several times a week, members take part in and lead language tables to practice their French, Portuguese, Japanese, German and Spanish with one another. Our partnership with the Princeton Area Alumni Association allows our members to take part in weekly Propeller Talks, where speakers share their research in biotechnology, robotics, and other STEM fields. We continue to partner with the Sexual Harassment/Assault Advising, Resources, and Education (SHARE) office on campus, and educate our members on interpersonal violence intervention and prevention.

Technology

Over the past semester, Quad has expanded its the capabilities of its Tech and Game Rooms in order to meet the needs and wants of our members. We provide printing through the University PawPrint system, charging stations for phones and computers, and televisions and gaming systems for entertainment. Our TV room features a television equipped with streaming services such as HBO Now, Netflix, and Hulu for members to enjoy, and we love to host events where members can experience VR and play games on an Oculus. Our game room features all major gaming consoles, as well as a large library of games. The Quadrangle website features information for current and potential members such as scholarship information, weekly menus, and officer bios.
