

Education/Intellectual Engagement:

Despite the unprecedented nature of virtual learning our Cannon members have continued to excel academically. As of May 2020 three of our current members were named academic all-ivy athletes, and more recently Carlie Littlefield '21 has been named the 2021 NJIAIW Woman of the year! While we currently do not have access to the club as a study location we have been looking into revamping spaces such as our computer room and library to ensure we can host academic our members in an increased academic capacity when we are back in person. Over the last few weeks we have been hosting alumni career panels where our members are able to ask specific questions on the pathways into the professions they are interested in. These have been offered via zoom in the realms of Healthcare, Real estate, Law, Engineering, and Tech.

Technology & Media:

2021 is truly the year of Zoom and as a club we have been utilising the platform to allow for our membership to keep in contact while we are unable to socialise in person. For Bicker this year we used a program called Glimpse in order to carry out our conversations and get to know prospective members.
