I. House Improvements

- The back deck of the house has been renovated, maintaining and repainting an area of the house that receives a large amount of wear.
- The second floor has been completely renovated, with new flooring in every room. Many walls have been repainted and hardwood walls in the balls room have been sanded down and will be restrained soon. These changes will revitalize many of the most popular social areas in the club.
- Plans have been approved to restructure the first floor bathroom. The entrance will be moved from the coat room to the adjacent in the Willard's room. The space that used to be the coat room will become a separate ADA compliant stall adjacent to the rest of the bathroom.
- A mural has been added to the third floor in honor of the officers who are members of the class of 2021, who led Terrace during the COVID-19 pandemic.

II. Community Engagement

- We recently released a Land acknowledgement statement to recognize the history of the land upon which Terrace F. club was built. This land is a part of the traditional homeland of the Lenni-Lenape people. In making this statement we seek to honor, support and advocate for the Indigenous individuals in our community.

- During the height of racial protests this summer we held a pair of town halls with both our own members, but also guest speakers and alumni to discuss the issues of racial inequality both at Princeton as a whole but also at Terrace.
- When Terrace closed last spring due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we continued to pay our staff to support vital members of both the Terrace and wider Princeton community during a trying and difficult time.
- In order to promote safe social distancing practices, Terrace distributed reusable cloth masks to all members who requested one for no cost. It is important to Terrace that our members understand the importance of social distancing and have the resources available to them to maintain safe clothing protections.

III. Sustainability

- When we open again we will continue to compost and recycle.
- Once open we will continue to serve fourth course, an aptly named fourth course of the day served at 10:30 PM, in which members reuse dinner leftovers to cook a new meal. The practice significantly reduces Terrace's daily food waste.

Thanks to the Princeton Prospect Foundation for all the work they have done and continue to do. We appreciate them and, at Terrace we will strive to continue the great work done by those before us and to give future generations of Princetonians memories of kindness and love for those who we have the privilege of serving.
