### **Academics:**

Charter has been a consistent host of numerous Princeton professors, administrators, and other faculty. We have had several professors dine with us, and have several discussion tables formed by our members. Most noticeably, we also have a weekly open forum in the discussion of Christian principles. New computers have been installed to facilitate student productivity within our computer cluster, and we plan to network our printer to the campus' "All Cluster" network. ### **Technology:**
